

Keeping Sharp – Practical Ideas to Help you Work with your Children at Home

The fact is back-to-school isn't starting on time this year, and right now our start time is unknown. This leaves many parents wondering whether their kids will fall behind in their studies and how they can help them stay sharp and beat the boredom during the ongoing strike. So at GME, we came up with a list of fun and educational activities to do with your kids, and great websites to visit, during the strike. Please remember that one of the best things you can be doing right now with your children is to start building in routines (bed times, and study times) to help them strengthen their focusing and self-discipline skills, two very important attributes in achieving success at learning!

1. **Go for a nature hike** – This is a fun way for kids of all ages to keep up with both physical education and natural science. It is important for children to get at least an hour a day of physical activity to stay healthy and ready to learn. For younger kids, point out different kinds of plants and wildlife you spy along the way. Older kids can learn scientific identification skills with the assistance of plant and animal identification guides. 2. **Practice Practical Math Skills** – When out shopping with your kids, get them to pay attention to the prices of the items being purchased and try to determine how much money you will need to buy them. Teach children how to tell time with their own watch. Practice counting, addition, subtraction and multiplication skills using real money at home – what kid doesn't love money!
3. **Read, read, read!** - Set special time aside each day to read as a family, whether out loud with younger kids or for quiet time with older kids.
4. **Paint a picture** – Kids learn much more than just painting with this simple skill – young kids develop fine motor skills, while older kids can express themselves through a positive outlet.
5. **Write a story together** – take turns writing each sentence of the story and see what adventures you can go on together! This fun activity encourages team building skills, but the kids will have so much fun they won't even notice.
6. **Watch a Movie in French** – If in French Immersion, watch your favorite movie in French!

- Children can't navigate away to follow other youtube leads.
- There are only children's books on the site.
- While reading the videos generally only show the books versus seeing the reader, which I think distracts from the book.
- Animation on the site is limited to nice editing jobs that zoom to parts of the page.
- The books are frequently reordered to encourage listening to new books.
- Books have also been added in Other Languages. The tab with the globe icon labeled "Other Languages" ("Otras idiomas", "Altre Lingue", "Autres Langues", "Anderen Sprachen") acts as a portal between the site in different languages. Following the links will take you to a new site entirely in the target language. To change languages, go to the Other Languages tab and select desired language.

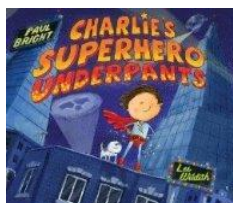
- **Read Aloud Books – for all grade levels (English)**
